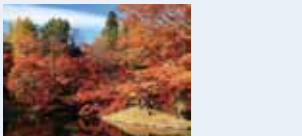

Okubungo's hot springs include those in the castle town, historic open-air baths along the river, and hot springs that offer a magnificent view of the plateau, enjoyed by both commers and the lords of the Oka clan in the old days. Writers and artists such as Tekkan Yosano and Santoka were also devotees.

The Okubungo Trail begins at Asaji Station in Bungo Ono. The 12 km route takes you through the rural landscape, passing by Yujaku Park, Fuko Temple, and Taketa's Oka Castle ruins before ending at Hanamizuki near Bungo Taketa Station.

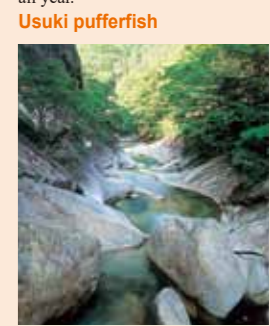

Hita, a town renowned for its water resources, has long been known as "Suikyo". Its hot spring inns are situated along the riverside, where you can also enjoy a boat ride. Amagase Onsen is one of the three major hot springs of Bungo, along with Bepu and Yufuin, boasting an abundance of hot water and a variety of spring qualities.

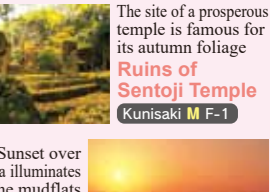

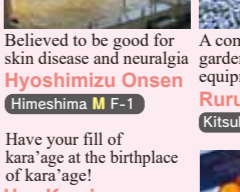
