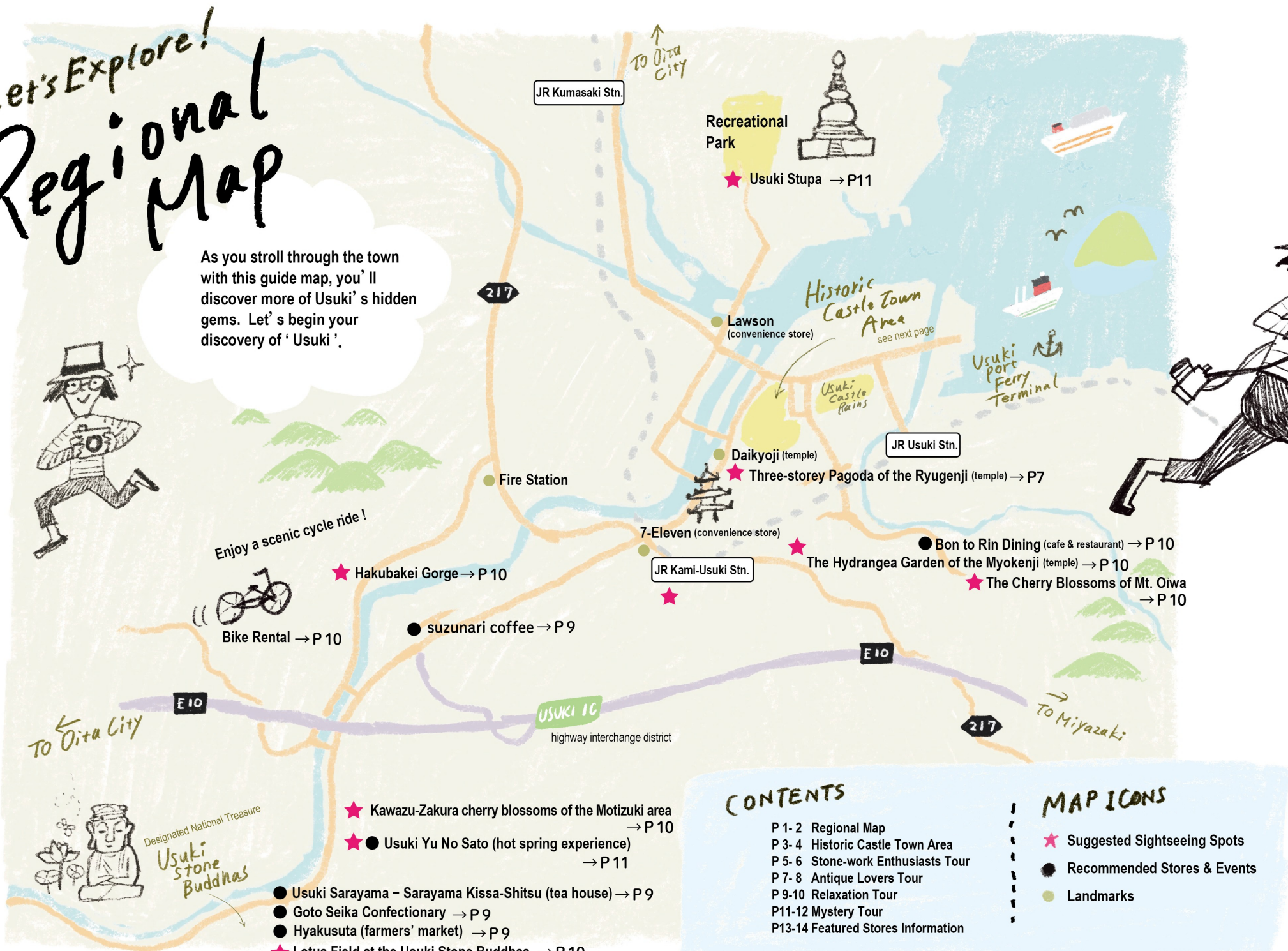

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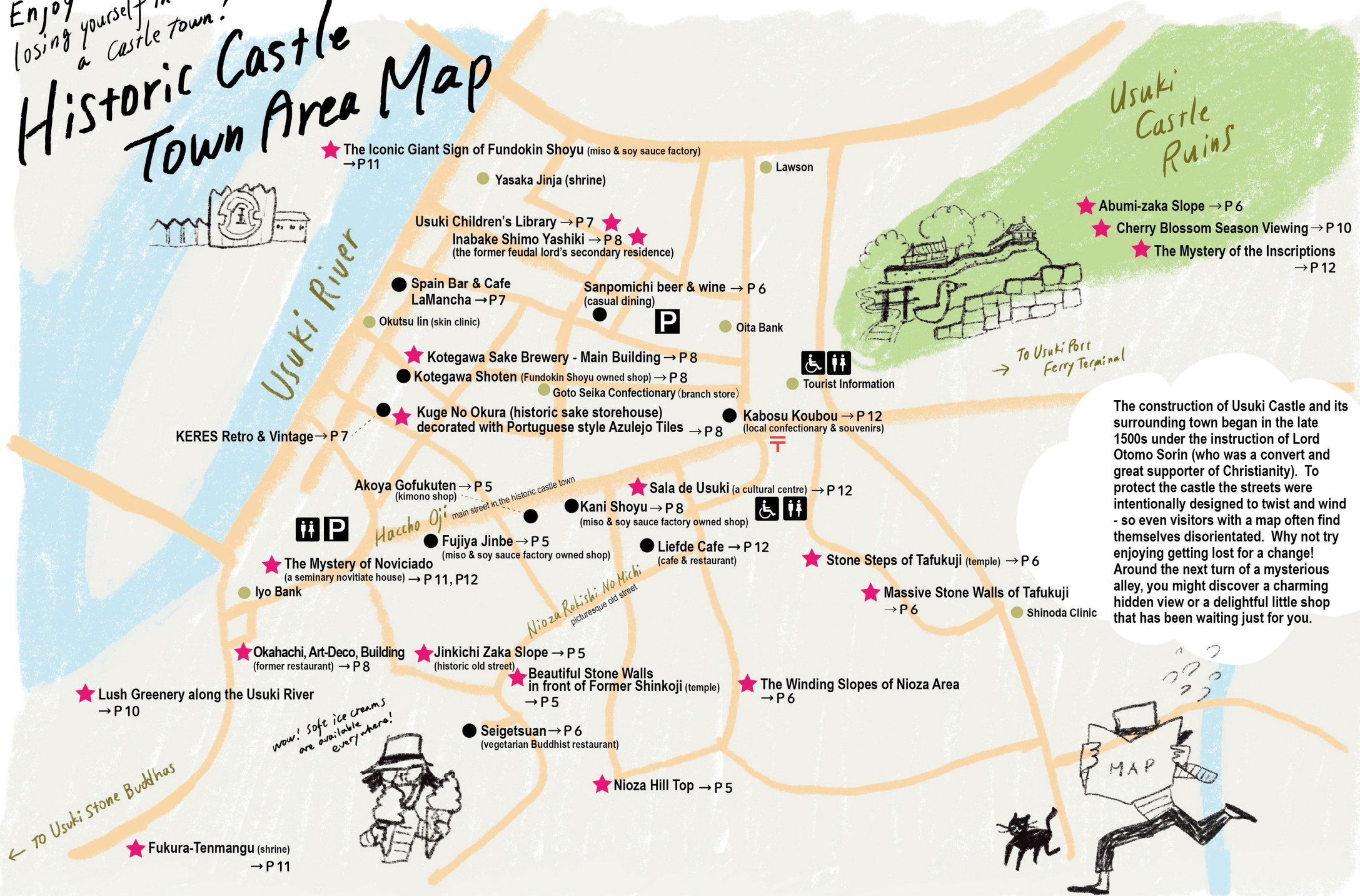

Historic Castle Town Area Map



The construction of Usuki Castle and its surrounding town began in the late 1500s under the instruction of Lord Otomo Sorin (who was a convert and great supporter of Christianity). To protect the castle the streets were intentionally designed to twist and wind - so even visitors with a map often find themselves disorientated. Why not try enjoying getting lost for a change! Around the next turn of a mysterious alley, you might discover a charming hidden view or a delightful little shop that has been waiting just for you.

Snap&Stroll through Usuki "Kimono Rental Town Walk"

Offered by the current 16th-generation of this shop's founder, who himself wears kimonos 365 days of the year, this experience lets you pick your favourite kimono and accessories -ranging from vintage through to modern styles, in an array of all colours imaginable. Stroll through Usuki's most photogenic spots and capture your special memories while professionally dressed in a kimono!

Film director Obayashi shot two movies in Usuki, falling in love with the town's stone walls and stairways-which appear repeatedly in scenes of his films. Why not take a walk and explore the hidden stone treasures that usually don't show up in travel guides?

Store-Exclusive Sweet "Soy Sauce Soft Ice Cream"

Since 1883, this traditional miso and soy sauce maker has been creating unique rich flavours that have become to define Usuki. At their flagship shop you can try the famous Soy Sauce Soft Ice Cream -creamy vanilla ice cream with their own signature katsuo (bonito) soy sauce blended in, producing a surprisingly perfect match! Be sure to check out the in-store-souvenirs, made from locally sourced ingredients.

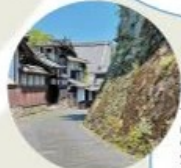

Start Your Walk through the Town in a Kimono!
Usuki's scenery is picture-perfect even wearing everyday clothes, but dressed in a kimono makes every photo extra special. Choose a kimono in a range of colours and patterns that elegantly contrast against the historic Usuki stone streets helping you capture that perfect travel shot!



Jinkichi-zaka Slope
This winding route cut-through and carved out of a plateau formed from the volcanic ash of Mount Aso, was deliberately curved during the Sengoku period (late 16th century) to help prevent attackers from advancing in a straight line. Today, its moss and flower-covered stone walls remain a quintessential part of Usuki's landscape.



Stone Wall Facing the Former Shinkoji
This stone wall once surrounded the residence where Kasuga no Tsubone the wet nurse of Tokugawa Iemitsu, the third Shogun of Edo era. It is also said to be where a woman connected to the Inaba family, Lords of the Usuki Dominion, tiled for a time. Its elegant curving form along the cut-through road makes it one of Nioza Area's most popular photo spots.

Nioza Hill
Blending Japanese and Western styles, Nioza Hill is lined with both traditional houses, Japanese/Western hybrid houses and unique old samurai residences set in a rich and varied scenery. From the different vantage points, you can enjoy views of tiled rooftops spreading out below, or through to Tsukumi Island floating in Usuki Bay, as well as in another direction the picturesque castle town beyond.



The Winding Slopes of Nioza Area
The stone-paved slopes leading up to the gentle hills of Nioza, twist and turn giving them a unique charm. Take a different path on your way up and down, so you can discover entirely new views along the way.



Stone Steps of Tafukuji
A popular photo spot during the Usuki Takekoyi (the Usuki Bamboo Lantern Festival), this historic temple was founded in 1601 and provides a wonderful backdrop to the many bamboo lanterns. The festival is held on the first weekend of November, with many bamboo lanterns lit up on these stone stairs. Even during the day, the staircase's graceful curves make it a perfect spot for to capture a memorable photo.



Bib Gourmand - Michelin featured restaurant Blissful Buddhist Cuisine
Enjoy Shojin Ryori, traditional Buddhist vegetarian cuisine that is prepared by the head priest of Kenshoji, which is a Rinzai Zen temple. Through many years of monastic training he is a true master the art of Buddhist cuisine. Each of the five menu options includes the restaurant's signature sesame tofu and assorted seitan (wheat gluten) dishes -both are truly outstanding. Discover how simple farm ingredients can be transformed into a feast for both the eyes and the palate.

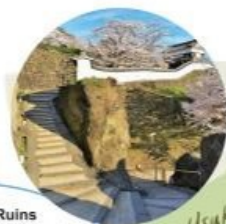

The Massive Stone Walls of Tafukuji
Tafukuji is said to have once functioned as a small fortress during the Edo period. Its 7-meter-high stone walls surrounding the temple give the site a dignified presence. Its grand, castle-like appearance makes this a must-see photo spot.



Usuki Castle Ruins Abumi-zaka
This spot features dramatic hairpin curves, deliberately designed to prevent attackers from charging straight up to the castle. In the spring time, you can enjoy picturesque views of the cherry blossoms contrasting against the historic stone walls.



A Must-Try: Steamed brown rice bread in a Seiro (bamboo steamer)
Enjoy a variety of specialty dishes

Run by its female owner, this cozy cafe is a rare spot open for a late lunch in Usuki. A favourite of female gatherings, it is popular amongst the local women. The must-try item is the Quiche Plate, only available at lunchtime and served with steamed brown rice bread in a seiro (Japanese bamboo steam basket). The fluffy, light bread pairs perfectly with the wholesome potato quiche, evoking memories and the charms of country living through rustic European cuisine.

Heigoro Shoda Memorial Children's Library

This charming two-storey wooden library was donated in 1918 by Heigoro Shoda, a local businessman from Usuki. Beautifully renovated in 2003 it has become a library exclusively for children, now offering a delightful space for young readers. A must-visit for anyone fascinated by traditional Japanese houses and historical architecture!



Ryugenji Three-Storeyed Pagoda

Built in 1858, this wooden three-storeyed pagoda is one of the few remaining from the Edo period. Inside, you'll find the statue of Prince Shotoku (574-622). If you look closely under the eaves of the first tier—four quirky guardian demons appear to be straining to hold up the roof! Don't forget to get a goshuin (temple visitors seal/stamp) as a special keepsake of your visit.

Built in 1917, this charming wooden station has a nostalgic atmosphere that has been featured in many movies and commercials. Thanks to the surrounding terrain, trains sometimes tilt quite dramatically while they are stopped at the station—a favourite sight for train enthusiasts and photography fans!



Kuge No Okura decorated with Azulejo Tiles

Built in 1888 for Usuki's Kuge Honten sake brewery, this building was originally used as a storehouse. Its exterior mural, made up of traditional Portuguese decorative tiles called "azulejos," was completed in 2000. The mural is about 30 meters wide and depicts the cultural history between Usuki and Portugal as an historic centre of Christian culture.



Okahachi, Art-Deco, Building

"Okahachi," a former restaurant in Tamachi, features a beautiful Art Deco designed entrance to this three-storey wooden building, reflecting its former elegance. This Taisho-era architectural style is extremely rare in Usuki.

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Inabake Shimo Yashiki (the former feudal lord's secondary residence)

The Inaba Family, former lords of the Usuki Dominion, moved to Tokyo following the abolition of the han (the feudal domains) system. This residence was built in 1902 as their lodging to use when returning to Usuki. Both the building and its Japanese garden showcase an exquisite example of samurai-style architecture.



A Perfect Match: Homemade Miso & Vanilla Soft Ice Cream

Founded in 1861, this is the owned store of Fundokin Shoyu. Their popular store-exclusive Miso & Vanilla Soft Ice Cream, made by blending two types of homemade miso with vanilla, is a big hit with tourists. In addition to Fundokin's classic products, you can also find here the store's unique original items such as "Tai Miso" (a traditional miso blended with sea bream, producing a rich, savoury flavor).

Try 'Today's Miso Soup' at this 400-year-old brewery.

The famous "Kani Shoyu," is Kyushu's oldest miso and soya sauce company, featuring a shop and cafe inside its traditional style building. The homemade "Miso Soup and Onigiri (Japanese rice ball) of the Day" must be tried! Produced from more than seven rotating ingredients, the choice of miso changes daily so you'll never taste the same soup twice. Ask the staff about the miso combination used that day and purchase some to take home, so you can recreate the flavour yourself later.

Enjoy a Blissful Tea Experience with the Exquisiteness of "Usuki-yaki" Porcelain

Usuki Sarayama is a complex featuring a workshop dedicated to the production of Usuki-yaki- a style of pottery born here during the Edo period and later revived in modern times. At the Sarayama Kissa-shitsu (tea house), many dishes are served on Usuki-yaki tableware, with the menu changing with the seasons to add a special seasonal charm to every visit. The cafe's elegant atmosphere, the potteries reputation and hands-on experiences attract many overseas visitors.

Fresh Greenery along the Usuki River (May)

Four bridges frame a harmony of vivid greens ranging from the deep shades of Mount Chinnan through to the fresher hues around the Daikyoji (temple) and Sumiyoshi Jinja (shrine), that glow in the early summer light.



Cherry Blossoms at Usuki Castle Ruins (late March)

One of Oita's finest cherry blossom spots, where you can enjoy both sightseeing and hanami picnics beneath blooming Somei Yoshino trees, -creating photogenic iconic scenes by day and night.



Indulge in Heavenly Sweets with Local Fruit

A popular dining cafe known for its signature homemade roast beef topped "Bon to Rin Donburi". Also try the seasonal selection of lavishly made 5-6 sweets, each made with local fresh fruits to delighting the heart and satisfying the appetite. Whenever you visit most delicious encounter awaits.

Hakubakei Gorge Autumn Leaves (Late November)

Hakubakei Gorge is one of Oita's most popular autumn foliage viewing spots to enjoy the breathtaking spectacle of intense reds and yellows of the seasonal leaf changes. The enhancement of the gorge was completed in 1834, by local stonemasons and merchants, as a 'mini Ise pilgrimage' alternative including the construction of a sacred pathway of 8 stone bridges crossing the gorge leading to a shrine. Don't miss this historical, spiritual landscape full of charming details while enjoying the stunning Autumn colours.



Ooiwa Cherry Blossoms (late March)

At the foot of Chinnanzan Mountain, Ooiwa can be seen from the city. When the cherry blossom blooms its mountain side cherry trees turn the whole area pink. With stunning views of the city and the Bungo Channel it is a perfect spot for a short hike and a bit of scenic sightseeing.



An hour to two hours walk starting from the Tourist Information

Myokenji Hydrangea Garden (June)

Located at Myokenji (temple), this garden features around 2,000 hydrangea plants of 200 different varieties. While it's popular locally, it's still a hidden gem for overseas visitors to discover. Capture a rare heart-shaped hydrangea on camera and who knows-love might blossom too!



A half hour walk starting from the Tourist Information

Kawazu Cherry Blossoms in Mochizuki Area (late February ~ early March)

Just a minute away from Usuki IC on the way to the Usuki Stone Buddhas, a charming row of Kawazu cherry trees lines the road. The bright yellow rapeseed flowers along the embankment make it a perfect early-spring spot for photos!

Lotus Fields at Usuki Stone Buddhas Park (July)

In July wake up early to enjoy over 1,000 blooming lotus flowers. Planted by local residents and volunteers in the fallow rice paddies, the flowers can be admired while enjoying the fresh morning air, alongside seeing the designated National Treasure of the Usuki Stone Buddhas.

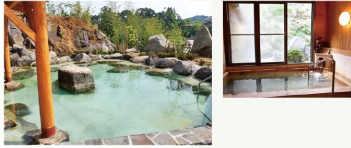

Silky Hot Spring: Glow & Relax at Yakushi No Yu

Take a break from cycling or walking at Yakushi No Yu, where its silky, lotion-like waters heal both body and the soul. According to its founder, a Kannon in the form of the Goddess of Mercy appeared in a dream guiding him to the discovery of the hot spring -Usuki's secret spot full of mystical charm! *Guests with tattoos are requested to use the more private family bath.

What's seems ordinary for locals might be a total "What's this!?" moment for travellers. Explore these quirky spots and discover new stories not found in guidebooks!



Snap the Giant Sign at Fundokin Syoyu!

Founded in 1861, Fundokin Syoyu (soy sauce) sits on a sandbank in the Usuki River. Its huge, eye-catching sign cries out to be photographed! The name combines "fundo" (symbolising honesty) and "kin" (gold), derived from the first companies president's name Kinjiro Kotegawa. Snap a photo here- it might even bring a little extra fortune!

Usuki's Giant Buddha: A Rare Photo Opportunity!

Located near the designated Japanese National Treasure of Usuki Stone Buddhas, Usuki Yu No Sato offers hot springs for both overnight stays and day-use. According to the founder, in his dream, a Buddha appeared requesting that statues be enshrined at this spot. This gave rise to the Usuki Daibutsuden consisting of 70 statues. Completed in 2019, the Giant Stone Buddha here has become a rare photo location where visitors can even "high-five" the Buddha if they so wish!



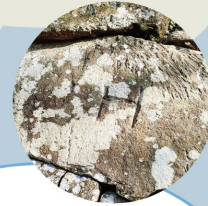
Usuki Stupa

With its cake-like appearance, this white stupa is actually an exemplary Buddhist monument. This brilliant white Peace Pagoda watches over the City of Usuki. From the main tower, you can enjoy a sweeping panorama of Usuki Bay and the city below.



The Mystery of the Inscriptions at Usuki Castle Ruins

On the stone walls near (A)Tatami Yagura, (B)Tsukimi Yagura, and (C)Kurogane-mon Yagura (defensive turrets), you can find mysterious carvings that still remain undeciphered to this day. Were they marks left by the stonemasons who built the walls-or symbols linked to the Feudal Lord Otomo Sorin and Christianity? Enjoy a stroll as you unravel the mystery.



Usuki's Organic Kabosu Treat Kabosu Soft Ice Cream

Usuki is famous for its 'kabosu', a fragrant Japanese citrus fruit. Their famous Kabosu Soft Ice Cream is made from organic yellow kabosu juice, having a refreshingly mild sweetness that is loved by all ages. The shop also offers a wide selection of sweets made from organic kabosu- that are perfect as a wholesome, healthy, and memorable souvenir of your trip.

The Mystery of the Noviciado

'Sala de Usuki,' currently serves as an event and cultural space that is modelled after the seminary called Noviciado established in Usuki by Saint Francis-Xavier during the era of the Feudal Lord(daimyo) Otomo Sorin -who championed and converted to Christianity, this was a training and theology centre for Japanese Christian clergy. Its unique European inspired architecture and exterior draws many visitors who are eager to take photos of a snapshot from history. While the exact location of the original Noviciado remains unknown, historical sources such as Luis Frois' 'History of Japan' suggest it was somewhere in the Tatamiya-machi area. As you stroll through the surrounding streets, imagine being part of James Clavell's famous novel "Shogun" or Shusaku Endo's "Silence" seeing the landscape of what was once called the "Rome of Bungo." (Bungo was the name of the province that time before the unification of Japan.)



Fukura Tenmangu (shrine): The Red Cat That Brings Good Fortune

Located in the Hira-Sozu area, Fukura Tenmangu is home to many red cat figurines and charms. The term "Akaneko" (red cat) originated from a Meiji era feud between Hira-Sozu and the city's commercial district. Today, these red cats are now enshrined as iconic lucky charms for prosperous business. Every year on February 22 (Cat Day), a special edition goshuin (visitors shrine seal/stamp) draws cat lovers from far and wide!



Usuki Fugu Burger: A Tender, Springy Delicacy!

The city's only restaurant serving deep fried Usuki fugu as a burger. Choosing the thick cuts, from the parts usually used for sashimi, help bring out the fugu's signature tender, springy texture and full flavour. Enjoy it alongside fries made from Usuki's premium seasonal vegetables and a natural strawberry milkshake packed with local strawberries. The perfect way to savour the best of Usuki's local specialties in one meal!
